## What's the best advice you can give future students to maximize their experience abroad?

"Disconnect from home. Don't always be on your phones. Take the time to really connect with your group and engage with as many people in the native culture as possible."

"Practice Thai before you get here. Know basic phrases and it will help so much! Thai people love to hear foreigners speaking (or attempting) Thai. "Take every experience available. Go outside your comfort zone and do things you normally wouldn't. The time goes by so quickly so make the most of it."



## What advice do you have for students to budget and spend money wisely?
