
"Enjoy every minute of it. You may get homesick, but you will be home before you know it. Enjoy it while it lasts, because you will make memories that you will remember forever!"


What advice do you have for students to budget and spend money wisely?

"Stay in some nights. You might not think that going out a lot adds up, but it does. Stay in and enjoy time with your host families."


"Using the cafeteria and eating dinner with your host family will save a lot of money as well as trying to use the bus or walking instead of taxis whenever possible."
