"Be open minded and be willing to try new things. Pretend like every day is your last day in Madrid and regardless of how tired you are go out and explore. You can sleep when you get home."


"When trying to learn a new language, refrain as much as possible from speaking English with your friends. It makes it much more difficult to completely immerse yourself in the language you wish to learn."


### What advice do you have for students to budget and spend money wisely?

"Look for great deals on certain nights and picnics in the park are so fun and cheaper!"


"I would recommend keeping up with how much you've spent at the end of every day. Being aware of how much you have in the bank at all times can you help you make frugal choices."
